This document is aimed at providing Beneficiaries with guidelines on how to use the Erasmus+ Project Results Platform and guiding them step-by-step in the process of uploading and submitting the project results and thus making them publicly available. 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Introduction

Dear Beneficiary,

If you are reading this guide, you have passed the selection stage and your project has been awarded a grant under the Erasmus+ programme. Congratulations!

What is the Erasmus+ Project Results Platform

[E+ Project Results Platform](#) (E+PRP) is a dissemination platform that offers a **comprehensive overview of all projects funded under the Erasmus+ action grants**, as well as some projects funded under the previous programmes (Lifelong Learning, Youth in Action, Tempus, Erasmus Mundus, etc.).

E+ PRP has a public interface and restricted working areas called **Beneficiary** and **Officer Dashboards**. Project details about the Erasmus+ funded projects are displayed on the public interface. To search for projects, you can type a keyword in the search box or select filter criteria. From the list of projects, you can select several projects and add them to your booklet to download PDFs.

The Beneficiary Dashboard should be used to upload the results and submit these for review. Once a project is submitted for review (do not forget to press **submit** when all your results are ready), the project is sent to the **Officer's Dashboard**. The project will not appear on your dashboard while being reviewed by the project officer, you will have the project details back on your dashboard when the review is completed or if modifications are needed. The Officer Dashboard should be used by project officers in order to perform the assessment of projects results to validate their publication.

Access to the dashboards is granted via **EU Login**, the European Commission Authentication Service.

Who does what? Beneficiaries and Project Officers

Project Beneficiaries are **coordinators** of European projects that have received European Commission's grant for action. There is **one** email address associated to the project in the

database. Their obligation is to upload projects results into the E+ PRP; together with other basic information about the project i.e. coordinator and partners contact details, logo and website.

Officers are staff of the European Commission, Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA) and National Agencies (NAs). They are responsible for checking and validating projects results before publication, as well as, for identifying good practice examples.

What project data is available to the public?

Project details are: title and description of the project, key action and activity, duration and grant amount awarded.

Contact details of the coordinating organisation and its partners are hidden by default in accordance with GDPR compliance. The coordinators can choose which data should be publicly available according to the mandate from partners.

For which type of projects the submission of results on the E+PRP is mandatory?

The submission of results is required for all centralised actions managed by EACEA and all KA2 projects managed by National Agencies as part of the contractual agreement for the grant(s). The submission of results is strongly recommended for KA1 Mobility actions and KA347 Structured Dialogue with Policy Makers.

Access to the E+PRP


Login Credentials

Upon selection, you will receive a message from the Agency where will be invited to sign the grant agreement (contract). When the Agency receives your signed contract, the grant agreement enters into force.

This is the moment when your project becomes available in the E+PRP. Project details about your project are displayed on the platform as shown in the Figure 1.

Summary

The project "BRAVE ME" is for 13-17 olds from 5 different countries - Estonia, Latvia, Greece, Spain and Romania, for improving their communication skills and self-esteem, getting braver through increased self-confidence and breaking stereotypes and creating more cultural understanding by acting together with 45 people (8 youth + 1 group leader from each country) for 7 days.

The project is managed and activities are all planned and managed by young people, the participants themselves. Every country will prepare workshops for other young people on the themes „Ability and courage to communicate“, „Self-esteem and your opinion matters“, „Stereotypes and equal opportunities“ and „Media“ during one day at the youth exchange. In the evenings each country introduces their culture, food, language and other original things to the other participants. So every participant gets a good experience in organizing activities as well as participating. Activities are all interactive and creative, include a lot of communication in mother and foreign language (English), group-work and discussions.

One of the activities of the project is making short videos of braking the stereotypes that young people have and together with that also getting a better understanding on media and understanding how media influences out thoughts. This makes the participants have critical thinking for the mass media news and influences and the videos are a good way of educating other young people all around Europe and beyond about equal opportunities and tolerance. Many of the participating young people have their first chance of getting to know someone their age from totally different cultural background, so it will enhance tolerance and understanding of cultural differences.

It is very important as todays youth are tomorrows leaders and decision-makers, also it is very common to have international co-workers nowadays, so young people need to create the understanding and tolerance for other cultures.

The main week of the youth exchange takes place in Venevere Recreation Centre in Viljandi County, a beautiful place in Estonian nature with very good facilities for this kind of events, on 20.- 26.08.2017.

There will be an APV meeting on June 27.-28, 2017 in Viljandi, Estonia where we expect 2 persons from each partnering country to plan the exact methods each country is going to use during their day so that it will all form a good whole youth exchange week.

Entry point

Once your project becomes publicly available in the E+PRP, you receive an automatic notification with a link to your Beneficiary Dashboard (Figure 2).

The email notification is sent to the person identified as a contact person of the project in the application form. Only this person has access to the Beneficiary Dashboard, unlike the Mobility Tool. For additional access for colleagues or partners, please contact EAC-PROJECTSPLATFORM-HELPDESK@ec.europa.eu mentioning the project reference and contact details of the additional persons.

How to access the Beneficiary Dashboard via EU Login?


In order to log in to your dashboard, click on the Beneficiary Dashboard link sent in the initial email notification (Figure 2). Alternately, you can start from the E+PRP landing page <http://ec.europa.eu/programmes/erasmus-plus/projects/> and then click on Manage my projects as shown in the Figure 3. [Manage my projects](#) is also available in the main navigation.

You will need to be a **Project Officer** or **Project Beneficiary** with a valid EU Login to be able to update your project.



EU Login

Once you click on the Beneficiary Dashboard link from the initial notification or [Manage my projects](#), you will be re-directed to EU Login, the European Commission's Authentication System – formerly known as ECAS (Figure 4).

The email address you use to enter EU Login must be the same as the one you have provided to receive email notifications regarding your access. If you introduce a different email address you will not be able to access the Beneficiary Dashboard.

NB: Make sure that no other application using EU Login is open and running in the background.

If you have lost your EU Login Password or you need to create a new one, click on the hyperlink "[Lost your password?](#)" as indicated in the Figure 5, and follow the instructions.


If you receive an “Access Forbidden” message (Figure 6) after you have inserted your login credentials, follow the instructions below:

- Before entering the system ensure that you have closed all other windows/tabs, you have cleaned your cache and history and you have no other service open/running, which requires authentication through EU Login, such as the Mobility tool.
- After doing that, enter your Beneficiary's Dashboard:

- **Make sure that you are logged in using the correct e-mail address, which is the e-mail address of the official contact person, mentioned in the application form as well as in the e-mail notification you received from us.** Use this e-mail address as your username and enter your password.
- If you do not have an EU Login account associated to that email address, then create one by clicking on the "Create an account" (Figure 4).
- If you do not remember your password then click on "Lost your password" and a new password will be sent to your email (Figure 5).
- Finally, if you have gone through all the steps above and still experience troubles to connect to your dashboard, please contact the dedicated helpdesk at the following address:


Once you have introduced your login credentials, you will be asked to read the Terms and Conditions and accept them before you proceed (Figure 7). Please note that you will be able to read the Terms and Conditions of use of the platform at any time during the lifetime of your project. The links are available at the bottom of the dashboard.

Once you accept the Terms and Conditions, you will be able to see all ongoing projects you run under the Erasmus+ Programme in the upper part of the screen. Note: a series of useful links and documents is available in the lower part of the screen, as shown in Figure 8.

How to manage your personal data?

Contact details of your organisation and partners are hidden by default. Once you click on the icon “Manage my data”, you will be redirected to a new page (Figure 9). On this page you will be able to choose which contact details (email addresses, phone numbers, name of the contact person) you would like to make visible or keep them hidden for the public. We encourage you, nonetheless, to be visible and easy to reach by publishing at least one relevant contact detail.

Once you have decided which contact details should be published, click on the button “Save”. To return to the first page of the Beneficiary Dashboard, click on the “Go back” button.

Please note that the project website is the only one result that becomes publicly available during the lifetime of the project. As soon as you click on the “Publish Url” button, the website will be published in your project’s card.


All other results, including the project logo, will be published after being reviewed by your project officer in the framework of the Final Report assessment.

How to add results?

You can start adding the results of your project as soon as you have received an initial notification with the credentials to log into the Beneficiary Dashboard. During the lifetime of the project the results remain unpublished and available in your dashboard. As long as the project is ongoing, you can modify them at any time.

In order to start uploading the results, from the Project List (Figure 8) select a project for which you would like to add the results. Click on the pencil icon “Edit” (Figure 8) and you will be redirected to the Project Information page. Then, click on the tab “Results” and after it on the button “Add Result, as shown in the figure 11.

For each result you will have to create a separate entry. Once you click on the “Add Result” button, a pop up window will open and you will be requested to introduce a title, a short description, a category and a type of a given result (Figure 12, 13 and 14). You should only provide a description of the specific result and avoid repeating the information from your project summary. Once all requested information about the result is added, click on the “Save” button. Then, you can start uploading a next result. The maximum number of results that can be added to the platform is 450.

Please note that you are able to add only one attachment per result which size cannot exceed 100 MB. Below you can see a list of the formats supported by the platform:

- For Attachments: *.pdf; *.jpeg; *.jpg; *.tif; *.png; *.gif; *.mpeg; *.mpg; *.ogg; *.ppt; *.pps; *.xls; *.xlsx; *.doc; *.docx; *.rtf; *.txt; *.csv; *.mp4; *.mov; *.mp3






Please note that if for a given reason (copyright, literary translation, etc.) a result should not be publicly available, you can choose an option “Don’t publish” as shown in the figure 12 and 13. If you choose this option, the result will be still sent for the officer’s review but will not become published in your project card.

As of May 2022, all results published by beneficiaries on the project results platform must be GDPR compliant as stated in the enforced terms and conditions. All guidelines are available when the beneficiary adds results.

Submit Results

Once your project has reached its end date, you will receive an automatic notification informing you that you can submit your results for review. The status of your project will change into "Available for submission after all results uploaded" (Figure 14).

Once you click on "Submit for review", the project will disappear from your dashboard and will appear in the Officer dashboard for review.

Rejection of results

In case your project results are incomplete or inaccurate, or mandatory results are missing, you will receive a notification from your project officer telling you to go back to your dashboard and update the results (Figure 16).

Publication of your project results and update of your project card

When you receive the initial notification (Figure 2), you will be able to access the Beneficiary dashboard and start uploading the results.

Please note that during the lifetime of your project the results remain unpublished. They become publicly available only after the results have been reviewed and approved by your project officer and the project has been finalised (final payment approval).

Please note that the 'Submit for Review' button remains disabled until the end date of your project. Once the project reaches its end date, the 'Submit for Review' button becomes active and you can submit the results for the officer's review and approval.

Your project card containing contractual information can be updated during the lifetime of your project. Any changes on contractual data such as start date, end date, partners should be communicated to your project officer. Once approved by your project officer, these changes will be automatically transferred to your project public card.

Please note that at the final report stage all contractual data of your project will be updated with the information you have provided in your final report.
